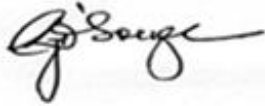
NOTIFICATION: END SEMESTER EXAMINATION – APRIL 2026 **INSTRUCTIONS TO THE STUDENTS**

- Students are advised to arrive on campus ONE HOUR prior to their respective examinations.
- The first session starts at 9:00 AM, the second session at 11:30 AM, and the third session at 2:00 PM.
- Students should bring their hall tickets and ID cards on all examination days. Students who do not have their ID cards/hall tickets must obtain a one-day admit note from the Dean. The hall ticket is the primary evidence for eligibility to write the examination. A student ID card is an additional proof and is not compulsory for writing the exam, but is mandatory to enter the campus.
 - Hall Ticket alone – Student is eligible
 - One-day note from the Dean + ID card – Student is eligible
 - One-day note from the Dean + soft copy of hall ticket (before exam) – Student is eligible
- Deans will be available in their respective rooms 30 minutes before the examination. Students may obtain a one-day note from any Dean, irrespective of their school.

- If hall tickets used for a few examinations are misplaced, students may bring a fresh printout of the hall ticket and submit it in the examination hall.
- Students will be permitted to enter the examination hall only 10 minutes before the commencement of the exam. Students must not be present in classrooms or corridors before this time.
- Students are not allowed to enter the examination hall after 10 minutes from the start of the examination. Students must remain seated for at least 30 minutes after receiving the question paper, irrespective of the duration of the examination.
- Students should leave their bags near the door inside the examination hall before taking their seats.
- Answers must be written only using a **black ink pen**. Use of pencil for writing or drawing is prohibited.
- Do not write the registration number inside the answer booklet.
 - Regular students must write the registration number only in the space provided on the question paper.
 - Supplementary students must not write the registration number on the question paper.
- Students must allow invigilators to affix the QR code/barcode and registration number sticker only after verifying the details.
- Students should bring their own pens, calculators, dictionaries, etc. Borrowing is not permitted without the invigilator's permission.
- Students are not permitted to write anything related to the examination on desks or benches. If any such material is found before the exam, it must be reported to the invigilator. Failure to do so will be treated as malpractice.
- Any queries must be addressed only to the invigilator. No communication is allowed between students.
- Students are strictly prohibited from bringing:
 - Mobile phones (even in switched-off mode)
 - Smartwatches or electronic gadgets
 - Books/notes (except permitted dictionary)
 - Writing pads or pencil pouchesMere possession of such items will be treated as malpractice. Writing on any part of the body is also considered malpractice.

- Students must keep all electronic gadgets inside their bags.
 - Students are not allowed to use the washroom during the examination, except in case of medical conditions (to be informed in advance).
 - Students must write the correct course code number as given on the question paper.
 - Seating arrangements will be available on the University Website. Supplementary seating arrangements will be displayed one day prior and also on the examination notice board.
 - If a registration number is not found in the seating arrangement, students must approach the Examination Help Desk (outside the COE Office).
 - For regular students:
 - Core course answer scripts: 28 pages
 - Multi-disciplinary/Language answer scripts: 12 pages
 - Graph sheets/maps are attached.
