Session	Details
Arrival & Classroom Allocation	Students guided to classrooms by mentors; attendance taken.
Ice-Breaker & Self-Introduction	Interactive games and peer introductions to build comfort and connection.
Overview of the College	General introduction to the campus, SJU’s mission, student life, and infrastructure.
Interaction with the Dean	Insights into academic culture, university support, values, and regulations.
Address by Welfare Officers	Overview of student welfare services, attendance regulations, procedures for reporting medical or personal concerns, and the support mechanisms available to assist students during their studies.
Break-(15 mins) : 10.30 - 10.45 am	Informal interactions among students can be encouraged; they may use the restrooms.
General English Screening	English language proficiency screening conducted to assess students and facilitate their placement into CS1 and CS2 groups.
Interaction with NCC Representatives	Introduction to the National Cadet Corps (NCC), its objectives, activities, training opportunities, camps, and the benefits of enrolling as an NCC cadet. Students will also be informed about the enrolment process and participation requirements.
Interaction with the Mental Health Counsellors	Introduction to counselling services, mental health awareness, stress management, and available support resources.
